In 1977 the Museum of Contemporary Art in Chicago asked Stuart Cohen to work with the world famous artist Claus Oldenburg on the construction of two demountable exhibition structures. These structures were to display Oldenburg's collection of dime store objects and souvenirs that were inspiration for the artist's work. Originally conceived by Oldenburg as a "museum of popular art" it was to be in the shape of a (Mickey) mouse head. In addition to the *Mouse Museum* the MCA's exhibit included a second structure, a *Ray Gun Wing* to display a collection of toy ray guns and gun shaped objects. The two structures were displayed at four other museums including the Whitney Museum in New York. In 1979, the structures were purchased by the Museum Ludwig in Cologne, Germany and have been on permanent display there.

They are currently on display at the Museum of Modern Art until August 5, 2013
