




# The Houses of Howard Van Doren Shaw

Stuart and Julie were asked to contribute a chapter to a just published real estate consumer book, *What to Know Before Buying or Selling a Home: Chicago.* 




# **Houses for All Regions**


### **Design Evanston Guide**
