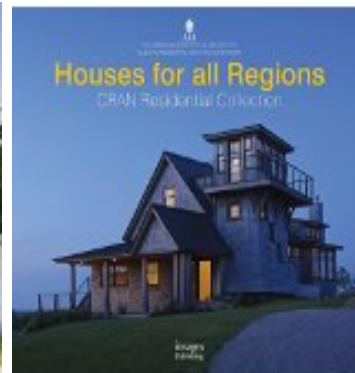


Our work is featured in three books out this summer:

Julie was asked to sit on the nominating committee for new fellows for the Chicago Chapter of the AIA. She recently participated in a panel assembled to review the preservation plan for the Randolph Street Market area of Chicago. In June, Julie was invited to be part of the three day final review of thesis projects prepared by the graduate students in the School of Architecture at the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana.

Recent Lectures

In May, Stuart lectured on the development of the **Arts and Crafts Movement in Chicago circa 1900**. He spoke to the Lake Forest Affiliates of the Art Institute of Chicago. The lecture was at Shore Acres Country Club following a tour of the Arts and Crafts furniture collection at **Crab Tree Farm** in Lake Bluff.

In June, Stuart lead a tour of 40 architects who visited **Howard Van Doren Shaw's Ragdale House** (1897), **Lake Forest's Market Square** (1916), and two private houses and gardens in Lake Forest also designed by Shaw. The tour was part of the national convention of the **American Institute of Architects** which was held in Chicago this year.

His book on Shaw's houses has been picked up by Monacelli Press, New York and will be published by them in the Spring of 2015.
